Students from Gymnasium Puchheim, an academic high school in Puchheim, Germany, and their two teachers are visiting Cherry Hill East as part of part of a two-week U.S. tour which includes field trips to Philadelphia and New York City. Superintendent of Schools Dr. Joseph Meloche, Board of Education member (and East parent) Steve Robbins and the two Gymnasium Puchheim teachers were among the honored reception guests. Two of the visiting German students – pictured above with East Principal Dr. Lawyer Chapman – dressed in traditional German clothing which today would be worn for festivals and events.

As part of the exchange program, participating German and U.S. students will be immersed in the culture and language of the country they are visiting. The program provides an opportunity to improve students' global awareness, intercultural understanding and language skills. It is also a great way to develop lifetime-long friendships and create unique international experiences by connecting with "real" people and being integrated into their daily life.

Students will return home not only speaking the language better, but with a greater sense of confidence, maturity, and independence. The exchange program will focus on the similarities and differences between our two countries.

At the reception, Dr. Chapman expressed his excitement about the program. "In a time when there are people trying to tear the world apart, these students, teachers and host families are participating in a program that helps bring the world together," he said.

The exchange program was organized by Cherry Hill High School East German teacher Anna Feinleib and Gymnasium Puchheim English and Geography teacher Lars Loock, with the help of East Chemistry Teacher Elizabeth

He has spent countless hours and dollars working to help our team bond, and to prepare us for cases in New York City and New Brunswick. He gives so much of himself to our team, and we all have so much respect for him. Not to mention, he helped me do extremely well on both AP Exams that he prepared me for. The man knows how to motivate better than anyone I know.

"How do I show my West pride? I always wear West gear. West baseball, West basketball, you name it...I own it! Besides that, I enjoy telling my neighbors and friends about all the great
